Community Development and Safety Team Update – January 2019

Our Community Development work facilitates employee volunteering to support and strengthen community groups throughout Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.

Last Quarter:

You raised £24,500 for the starter packs received by 18 charities in Leicester city and Leicestershire that support Homelessness. More interestingly is how much fun our businesses had fundraising and buying items for the project, the most interesting so far has been a member who raffled a day of annual leave!

Through your generosity we have been able to support an amazing 18 projects including hostels, foodbanks, homelessness action groups and housing projects.

Our members supported 28 events across the city and county, ably aided by 166 employee volunteers from 18 of our member firms. That's a whopping 830 hours of great volunteering. 18 community groups benefitted from your festive magic this year. These organisations support hundreds of people in our local community and we loved visiting your activities to take photos, chat to the volunteers, service users, guests and really get to see the impact you as our members have made in the local area.

The WIRE project continues to enjoy success placing ex-offenders on work experience with a wide range of businesses across the city and county. This year we are aiming to place 60 people with local employers and based on past performance most of them will end up in full time work, back in Education and will stop offending. So a real "win win" for all.

We are excited that Thermo Fisher Scientific are now looking to work with the project. Demand for placements always outstrips supply **so we are keen to talk to members about how you can support the WIRE project by providing placements**. You will be surprised by the variety of talents we have waiting to be employed by you from white collar to creative, from manual to skilled labour we have lots of talented people wanting to get back into the workplace.



We have a breakfast event at the city hall on **Thursday the 21**st of **February** which we are running with DWP, Leicester employment HUB and Police and crime commission to share the benefits for the business community of employing exoffenders.

Children and Young People Team Update – January 2019

Our Children and Young People Team works with young people, schools and businesses to ensure that all young people have the skills, support and opportunities to achieve their full potential.

Last Quarter:

We were very excited to welcome some new staff to the CYP Team. Charlotte joined as the head of the team, and Steph and John will be working with care experienced young people. Charlie is now leading our work with homeless young people, and Keisha and Simran joined to help with admin. You can find everyone's details on our new website.

Over the last quarter our business volunteers have interviewed 718 students in schools across Leicester and Leicestershire by volunteering at the interview technique project events. This brings the total number of students covered since the start of the new school year (August 2018) to 950.

We've had some great successes in our work with unemployed young people. Gareth started a chef apprenticeship with Age UK while Martin entered part time employment with HMV. We had an excellent tour with Thermo Fisher, which helped young people learn about science, the impact it has on the world and roles that could make them a part of it. We also supported care experienced young people with employability and life admin skills and have been busy developing an independent living programme to help these young people gain the skills they need when leaving care.
